However, some cited challenges with affording staff who could support teachers through the NBC process. For example, Carroll County said that, due to budgetary shortfalls and staffing shortages, they could not hire NBC facilitators—who support teachers pursuing NBC—for the 2023-24 school year. Several districts also mentioned that they support NBC facilitators through temporary sources of funding (e.g., Maryland Leads grants).
